Background to our Holiday Clubs

Our holiday clubs aim to encourage connection to nature by providing a wide range of exciting outdoor play based opportunities to participants aged 6-13 years old. Our clubs have gained in popularity, and are a firm favourite for many local children. We are keen to continue to offer activities that inspire nature connection, curiosity and teamwork, build skills, confidence and love of nature, and to cater for the wide ages and interests of participants.

Holiday clubs run in school holidays from Easter (2 days), May half term (3 days), for the first 3 weeks of the summer holidays (4 days each week), and October half term (2 days), and we are keen to put in place a small team of capable staff to deliver this program. It would be advantageous if the Holiday Club Assistant Leaders can commit to the majority of dates listed, however we are happy to consider sharing the roles between Assistant Leaders who are able to commit to full blocks of dates.
