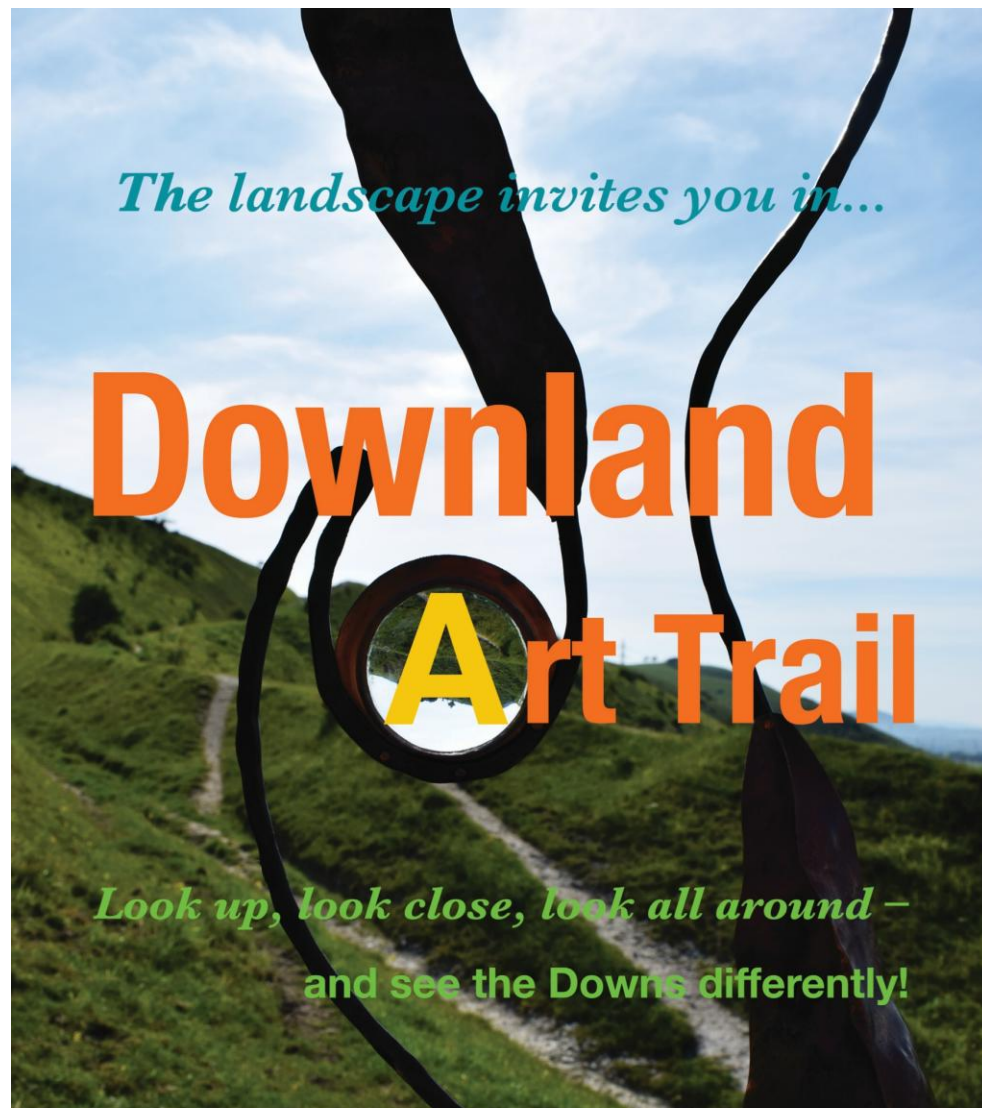

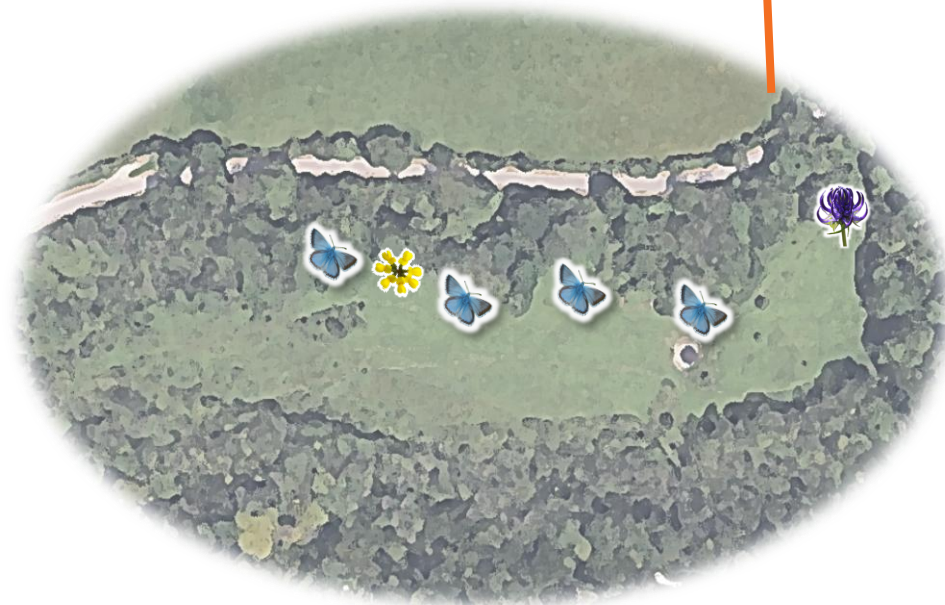
Welcome to the Downland Art Trail at Beautiful Butts Brow!
